1. BACKGROUND:

The Disaster Management Act, 2005 (DM Act, 2005) mandates all districts to develop their district disaster management plan taking into account the Hazard Vulnerability Capacity and Risk Assessment (HVCRA), prevention, mitigation, preparedness measures, response plan, and procedures. Further, National Policy on Disaster Management (2009) and NDMA's National Disaster Management Plan, 2019 identifies specific roles and responsibilities at National, State and local levels in context of various types of hazards. As per these policy documents and other NDMA guidelines, Union Ministry of Health as well as Health Departments at State and District level have been identified as lead agencies for biological emergencies, with supportive role to be played for other types of hazards that may have public health implications.

In view of the above, Union Ministry of Health and Family Welfare under its Central Sector Scheme "Health Sector Disaster Preparedness Programme" has initiated a Pan-India capacity building programme on "**Management of Public Health Emergencies for District Health Officers**" through a network of partner training institutions. The said capacity building initiatives intends to develop knowledge, skills and capacities of District level health officials for improving preparedness and response to manage public health emergencies and health impacts of disasters, so that they are able to manage and improve services in their districts. The said initiative also aims to train district level health functionaries to develop health sector disaster management plans, to contribute to overall disaster management planning of the district by guiding and implementing effective public health response and mitigation strategies in preparedness for and in response to disasters and other health emergencies, thus contributing to disaster resilience and responsiveness. The training modules for imparting these trainings has been prepared by this Ministry in collaboration with eminent institutions including All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), New Delhi; Postgraduate Institute of Medical Education and Research (PGIMER), Chandigarh; All India Institute of Hygiene & Public Health (AIHPH), Kolkata; National Institute of Mental Health and Neurosciences (NIMHANS), Bengaluru; AIIMS, Bhopal; NDMA, NDRF and other partner training institutions inculcating learning from COVID-19 pandemic management.

AIIMS, Patna being one of the identified partner training institutes conducted a **6-day training workshop** from **23rd to 28th September 2024** with 28 participants for the States of **Bihar, Jharkhand and Chhattisgarh**. Participants consisting of **12-14 District Level Health Officers** from each concerned State (**preferably mid-level and from regular service**) from district hospitals and above are nominated for this training programme.

2. TRAINING OBJECTIVE:

- Preparedness of the district health sector during the pre –disaster period for effective response and mitigation during a disaster.
- Enhancement of effective response of the district health sector during any disaster situation.
- Analysis of the gaps in the existing district healthcare system towards disaster resilience.
- Understanding important aspects of disaster management and facilitating the development of the district health sector disaster plan.
